The HPNLU COVID-19 Cell has recommended to promote all the students of 2nd, 4th, 6th & 8th Semesters of B.A. LL.B. & B.B.A. LL.B. to 3rd, 5th, 7th & 9th Semesters respectively.

The Vice-Chancellor placed the Agenda Item before the Academic Council and apprised that the HPNLU, COVID-19 Cell has recommended to conduct the End Term Examination within one month after regular classes are held and students join the University. It is submitted that in consonance with UGC/MHRD/Bar Council of India Guidelines/Directions &	The Academic Council deliberated the matter thoroughly. A reference was also made to the news reports indicating a decision of non-conducting of examination in the pipeline. However, as no decision can be taken by the Academic Council, the issue being in a premature stage, it was decided to approval this agenda item as proposed.	The Academic Council unanimously approved the proposal recommended the same to the Executive Council for further approval.

Notifications, the HPNLU COVID-19 Cell has recommended that this period of COVID-19 crisis, when regular examination cannot be conducted, shall neither be counted as reappear nor as a "chance" for eligibility to be promoted to the next respective session.

It is pertinent to mention that at present there is no outgoing class as 8th Semester of B.A. LL.B. & B.B.A. LL.B. will be promoted to 9th Semester now.

Item No. 5 To consider and approve conducting of online Examination for LL.M. 2nd Semester.

The Vice-Chancellor placed the Agenda Item before the Academic Council and apprised that in the present COVID-19 crisis it is not possible to conduct offline examination for LL.M. Students. In order to save their precious time the HPNLU COVID-19 Cell has recommended to conduct LL.M. 2 nd semester and reappear examinations online.	The Vice Chancellor apprised the members of the Academic Council that as per the UGC Notification all the outgoing batches need to be examined through online or other possible mode. In this regard the HPNLU, COVID-19 Cell has recommended online examination for LL.M. students (one year course) batch 2019-2020. The detailed modalities were placed before the members of the Academic Council. The members expressed their opinion that modalities proposed by the HPNLU COVID-19 Cell is approved. However, the same shall be subject to notifications issued by UGC and BCI from time to time in this regard. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor assured that if any notification is issued before the conduct of LL.M. To consider teaching of foreign languages with the use of MOOCs.

The Vice-Chancellor placed the Agenda Item before the Academic Council and apprised that the English Language is being taught to the students in 1 st & 2 nd Semester. It is proposed that the University be allowed to teach English in 1 st and 2 nd semesters while in 5 th & 6 th semesters they will be given option to study any one of the languages i.e. English, French, German, Spanish, Russian, & Japanese. It is further submitted that teaching, learning & evaluation of English, French, German, Spanish, Russian & Japanese can be done through MOOCs. This MOOCs course will be given four credits It shall be four credit course.	The Vice-Chancellor placed on record that as per the requirement of the Bar Council of India, foreign language may be offered during LL.B. five year integrated course. Keeping in mind the notification of UGC/MHRD the said requirement may be complied by adopting MOOCs. The Vice-Chancellor apprised the members about availability of various courses on foreign language as well as Indian languages. Prof. K.P.S. Mahalwar suggested that MOOCs offered by IIT Chennai may be referred.	After thorough deliberations, the members of the Academic Council unanimously approved the proposal and recommended the same to the Executive Council for further approval and also suggested that foreign language including Indian National language 'Hindi' may be taken up by students through MOOCs. The Academic Council unanimously approved the proposal and recommended the same to the Executive Council for further approval.

To consider the letter received from HP Government regarding request from Sh. Vice-Chancellor placed the Agenda Item before the Academic Council and apprised that the University received a letter from Chief Secretary (SJ&E), Government of Himachal Pradesh request from Sh. Vishav Mohan for reserving 01 sanctioned Teaching Post of Assistant Professor by earmarking in the identified subject of 'Sociology' in favour of Pwd (Visually Impaired) Category as per Roster Points criteria in terms of Pwd Act, 1995 & RPwD Act, 2016. Sh. Vishav Mohan also requested University to consider his case.

It is further submitted that Sh. Vishav Mohan has applied for Assistant Professor Sociology *vide* Advertisement No. HPNLU-A (7)-11 (ADVT)/2020/2-A dated 28-2-2020.

The Vice-Chancellor apprised the members that in the light of Supreme Court's decision Faculty Association of PGI vs. Union of India (1998 SC), single post cannot be reserved. She referred to sub-para (ii) of Para-13 of the said Office Memorandum of the Department of Personnel (AP-III), Government Himachal Pradesh vide No. PER(AP) -C-B (12) -3 / 2017 dated 22nd June, 2017 which says that "It is also clarified that the 1st point in the roster may be given to the persons with benchmark disabilities only in such cadres where the cadre consists of 25 or more posts" and UGC Letter dated 5th March 2018 which says that Roster in the University shall be prepared Department wise. As per the present sanctioned strength the cadre for Assistant Professor does not have sanctioned strength of twenty five. The members of the Academic Council considered the request of Sh. Vishav Mohan in view of the above & unanimously resolved that the demand of reservation for PwD (Visually Impaired) cannot be permitted. The Members of the Academic Council also deliberated on the issue and suggested University should observe State Government Memorandum for the purpose of reservation.

The members of the Academic Council unanimously resolved:

Decision

- a) Single post cannot be reserved as decided by the Hon'ble Supreme Court.
- b) Following the Memorandum of the Department of Personnel to Government Himachal Pradesh dated 22nd June, 2017, the post, which falls in the roster of for reservation **PwD** candidates shall be reserved irrespective of the fact that the post is from 'Law'/Management/Sociol ogy/ **Economics** Political Science.

The Academic Council unanimously approved the proposal and recommended the same to the Executive Council for further approval.

(xv) posted by the Registrar on 'Faculty HPNLU Whatsapp Group' provided: "This Order shall also be applicable to the officers/officials and research/teaching faculty working in the universities, research institutes such as IHBT/CSIR.IIT's, IIM, IIT, NIT etc".	The Vice-Chancellor apprised the members about representation made by Faculty members to work from home. The Members of the Academic Council clearly stated that such kind of permission cannot be granted in view of the notification issued by Himachal Pradesh Government dated 31 st May 2020, any such representation is defiance of the Government notification/order.	The Members unanimously rejected the representation and also gave a note of caution for the Faculty Members to refrain from making any such demand in defiance of the government notification/order. The Academic Council unanimously approved the proposal and recommended the same to the Executive Council for further approval.
The University is functional as per the Order of the Government of Himachal Pradesh.		
It is further submitted that such representation amounts to defiance of Government Order and also insubordination to the Government Institution.
