HPNLU CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY WITH A THOUGHT-PROVOKING LECTURE ON WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND EQUALITY

Himachal Pradesh National Law University (HPNLU) marked International Women's Day with an engaging and insightful lecture, focusing on the importance of women's rights and the ongoing fight for equality. The final speaker, Mrs. Dicky Dolma, shared her inspirational journey of overcoming obstacles. Growing up in a traditional village where women were restricted to their homes, Mrs. Dolma narrated her path to becoming a mountaineer. She encouraged women to embrace self-defence, discipline, and determination, emphasizing that women can achieve anything when they unlock their inner strength.

The event highlighted that while progress has been made, the journey toward achieving true gender parity is far from complete. From ensuring equal opportunities in education, employment, and leadership roles to advocating for the protection of women's rights, the event underscored the need for women to be empowered in every sector—whether in the workplace, at home, or in the public sphere. The discussions also pointed out that gender equality must be pursued with both legal frameworks and tangible, actionable solutions that address the societal and cultural barriers women face. The event
