Discussion The Vice-Chancellor After informed the members that in the light National Educational Policy 2020. it proposed to introduce Masters of Business Administration (Corporate Law). She also informed members that this was also placed before the Board of Studies and Board ofStudies suggested to fulfil all the requirements of AICTE while framing the curriculum and other issues relating to admissions and

deliberation, thorough the members Academic of Council resolved to approve the introduction of Masters ofBusiness Administration (Corporate Law). The agenda was unanimously approved with the following:

- 1. The University is authorised to take a decision to whether to start the programme present academic session or the next academic session.
- 2. If it is started in the present academic session the University's own entrance test dispensed with and University can do admissions on the merit score of other agencies such as CMAT or take admission on merit of the



examinations etc. The proposal for introduction of **MBA** (Corporate Law) was accordingly modified. Prof Manoj Kumar Sinha observed why not keep only MBA without law, as a model of NALSAR Etc. The Hon'ble vice chancellor informed that as per AICT the course has been formulated in the proportion 70:30:20 courses of management, law and practical training. The second suggestion related to the courses that relate to labour law papers may be renamed.

- applicants, who may apply for admission to programme in the present academic session.
- 3. From the next academic session the University may have its own National Entrance Test for the admission to the programme.
- 4. The courses related to labour law in the programme shall be revised in accordance with the Labour Code and a subject concerning industrial relations be added in the curriculum of the programme.

The Academic Council unanimously recommended the same to the Executive Council for approval.
